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A year ago Femail spoke to six of Britain's youngest mums. So how are they coping with life now?

A DISTURBING new report reveals that half of all girls under the age of 15 who have had intercourse regret doing so. Most feel pressurised into it and realise too late that they are not mature enough to deal with the emotional aftermath. For those who get pregnant, the consequences are even worse. Last May, six underage mums told Femail their shocking stories. One year on, we decided to see if they, too, regretted their experiences ...

Dan said he wanted another chance. We've been back together for a month now and I'm very happy with the way things have turned out.

I knew having a baby would be hard work — and it has been. But the hardest part has been coping on my own.

It's awful when you're exhausted and worried about this tiny thing that can't communicate with you and not having anyone to share that with. But I think all that will be easier now Dan is around.

He's already talking about having more children, but I've told him: 'No way.' Not because of the hard work, but because I want to concentrate on getting some more exams and finding a career. I'm going to college in September to study Spanish. By then, Libby will be old

ECAUSE I was so young when I had Sasha, I just was really my daughter and it took me ages to bond with her. Now she's older J find it easier to relate to her. She has her own personality

and I enjoy her more. when I had her. I was only 12 and didn't have clue I was pregnant my periods hadn't even started.

It was only when my sister spot-

ted stretch marks and told Mum that she took me to the doctor. By then I was seven months pregnant. If I knew then what I know now —

that you can get pregnant the first time — then I would never have had sex so young. There was no way that I was ready emotionally to have sex, let alone to deal with the outcome

I hated the experience, too. Afterwards, I wondered why I'd bothered.

I was terrified about the birth and felt very lonely. The other girls at school called me a slag and my mum and dad were furious. Dad even thought about kicking me out, but luckily he relented.

Everything happened so fast Five days after the doctor con firmed I was pregnant, my contrac-tions started. I went to hospital and they told me I'd need a cae sarean section because my body was too young to give birth.

I was confused and scared, but everything went OK and six weeks later I was back at school.

Things have been easier for the past year because I feel more responsible for Sasha. At the same time, I've been able to get on with my own life a bit more.

I'm doing my GCSEs this year -I'm taking nine. I want to do some thing for myself when Sasha is old enough, although I'm still not sure what. Having a baby so young has meant that I've not had much time

I haven't had a boyfriend since Sasha was born and I don't want one. I have a strong bond with my daughter and I don't want anyone messing that up. Besides, life is hard enough just looking after a baby, let alone having to cope with

The older Sascha gets, the easier life becomes. She's three now and can do more things for herself, such as washing and going to the toilet.

It's been hard but in the long run I think having Sasha has made me a stronger person. You have to be strong because someone else is reliant on you. I didn't have many expectations of how my life would

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
