Hip hoods and native foods are making this hot desert city cooler than ever.

Why Now: Tucson's designation as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy may have launched the Old Pueblo into the spotlight, but beyond its edible backstory, this vibrant Sonoran burg bursts with art, culture and captivating Arizona flair.

Where to Go: Hotel Congress has grown from a railroad stopover

to downtown Tucson's most happening hub. Stay in vintage digs complete with iron bedsteads and rotary phones that connect to an actual switchboard. To ensure a super restful night, book a Cactus Garden room. Greet the day downstairs at Cup Café or head further afield to Franks Restaurant. The sign out front proclaims "Elegant

Dining Elsewhere," but don't judge—Franks' überfriendly staff has delivered old-school diner perfection for almost 50 years. Work off your huevos rancheros at Sabino Canyon. Surrounded by cacti of every variety, the park's trails radiate beauty. Or pedal past street art and historic neighborhoods with Jimmy Bultman of Tucson

Bike Tours. Afterward, grab classic Sonoran hot dogs from Percheron at The Boxyard, a new food court constructed from repurposed shipping containers. The container concept continues at MSA Annex in the Mercado District, where desertcentric clothes and curios from Why I Love Where I Live convey a sense of place while local artists hawk hand-crafted wares at Mesa. Later, toast the day under the Tucson sun on the patio at Westbound. You can't go wrong with a pint of Dragoon Brewing Company's Santa Cruz'R ale. — **GINA DECAPRIO VERCESI**
