### **EASTERN MARKET**

What began in 1841 at Cadillac Square has grown into a significant meeting place for Detroiters, suburbanites and travelers around the world. Eastern Market is open six days a week and provides the community with fresh farm, meat and retail products from areas in Michigan, Ohio, Canada, Europe, the Middle East, Asia and various other farms in America. With other businesses such as Supino Pizzeria, the

Detroit Mercantile Co. and Division Street Boutique nearby, who wouldn't want to enjoy a warm Saturday afternoon in the city? And don't forget the 47th Annual Flower Day on Sun., May 19 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., where nearly 200,000 people will be surrounded by a vibrant selection of high-quality annuals, perennials, exotics and more.

#### **BOYKAS FARM MARKET**

A true, family-owned farmers market, Boykas Farm Market began in 1981 when Sylvester and Virginia DeCock started selling fruits and vegetables out of wagons on 23 Mile Road. Years after the passing of Sylvester, two of



his sons took over the business. With seasonal produce and plant varieties available (many of which are grown in a seasonal greenhouse), shoppers can choose from Michigan blueberries, red potatoes, apples and more.
