Though she has a role in the upcoming drama *The Bling Ring*, Sofia Coppola's film based on the true story of fame-obsessed teenagers who robbed celebrities' homes, Maika Monroe is doubtful about her impending stardom. "I don't think I have any fans yet," she says. Though she may not have experience with her own super fans, she has had a preview of what that



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might be like on set of her upcoming film, the Ramin Bahrani-directed *At Any Price*, in which she plays Cadence Farrow, the girlfriend of the recalcitrant Dean Whipple (Zac Efron).
